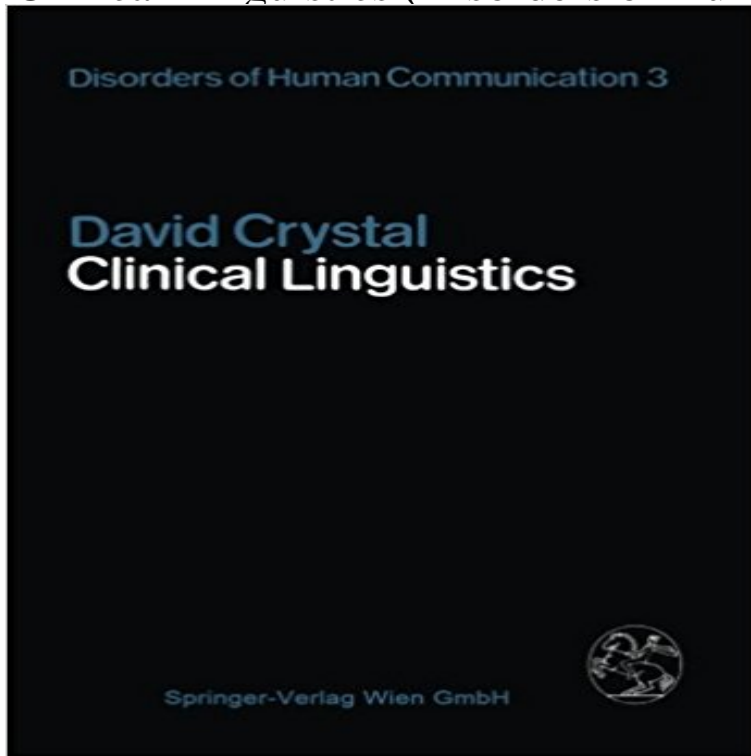


Clinical Linguistics (Disorders of Human Communication)
