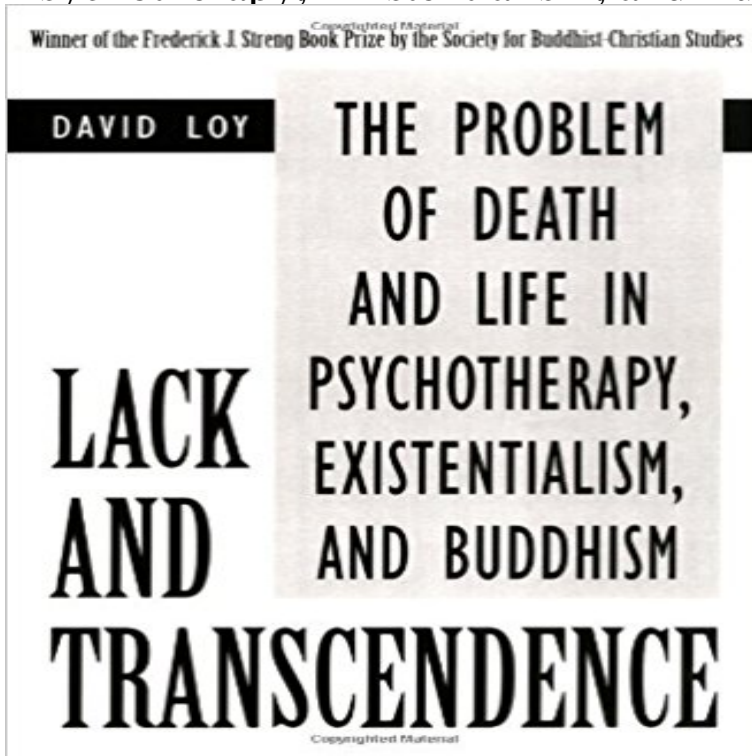


Lack and Transcendence: The Problem of Death and Life in Psychotherapy, Existentialism, and Buddhism
