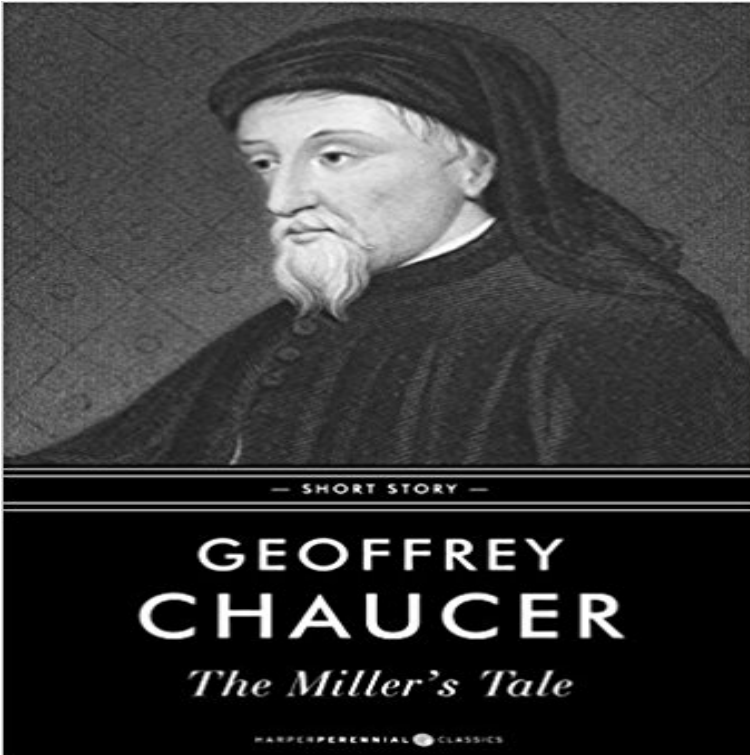


The Millers Tale
